The Department of English Language and Literatures invites applications for part-time Sessional Lecturer appointments (undergraduate literature courses) for the academic year 2020-2021.

Applicants must hold or be very near to completing a PhD in English Literatures, with recent experience of successful teaching of English Literatures, and evidence of teaching effectiveness. Applicants with UBC teaching experience and those with experience at other institutions are all encouraged to apply.

Candidates' applications should include

- a cover letter, including the subject of your PhD dissertation and a list of Literature fields in which you have published or taught recently
- a *curriculum vitae* (detailing post-secondary teaching experience)
- evidence of teaching effectiveness
- one sample syllabus for a course in one of your fields of literary study, plus up to two additional short descriptions (<200 words) of other courses you are qualified to teach

Applicants should also provide the names of two referees who can speak to their teaching effectiveness.

**Applications should be submitted by July 15, 2020.**

Appointments will be subject to operational needs and funding.
